# The Midlands - Mid Market Factsheet

**Key fact:** The mid-market in the Midlands consists of 3,099 companies and employs 1,790,175 people. In the East Midlands, there are 1,431 companies, employing 799,336 people. Meanwhile, in the West Midlands 1,668 midmarket companies employ a total of 990,839 people.

The average mid-market company in the Midlands has 578 employees, has been operating for 29 years. Mid-market companies in the Midlands find access to low-cost funds among their biggest challenges, especially compared to other midmarket firms in the UK.
