South West – Mid Market Factsheet



Key facts: The mid-market in the South West of England consists of 1,377 companies and employs 876,903 people.

The average mid-market company in the Wales has 637 employees, and has been operating for 28 years. Mid-market companies in the South West find it especially difficult to attract employees with the right skill set and to provide competitive wages and benefits as incentives. Compared to the rest of the country, mid-market firms in the South West have struggled to expand their workforce over the past 5 years, with just a 0.71% growth in the number of employees compared to 5.26% across all UK mid-market firms.
